### **OUR GRANTMAKING STORY**

In 2018, the Pelican Sound Golf and River Club Administration and Board of Directors welcomed the concept of organizing a way to manage the many requests for charitable fundraising and donation drive events. After exploring options, the **Pelican Sound Charitable Foundation** was created and approved by the PSGRC Board of Directors in 2019 and the journey began.

With over 94,000 charitable and nonprofit organizations in Florida alone, and over 6,000 registered in Lee County, the Foundation had to decide how to focus its efforts. Knowing that many of the community members donate generously to nonprofits in their out-of-state communities, it was determined that the Foundation would focus on *people in need* in its nearby communities in Southwest Florida. Thus, our mission statement was developed to reflect this goal.

The mission of the Pelican Sound Charitable Foundation (PSCF) is to support charitable and educational programs of organizations that improve the lives of SWFL residents in need.

Each year, community members are invited to nominate charities that provide direct services of food, clothing, shelter or health needs, or that provide direct educational services such as literacy or job skills for people in need in Southwest Florida. The committee then reviews the qualifications of the organizations, their nonprofit ratings and their financial stability to determine their eligibility. The charities that qualify are then invited to submit a grant application to the Foundation which is reviewed by the Grants Committee and presented to the Board for approval of funding.

Thanks to the generosity of our community members, during our first four years, we awarded \$380,000 to 19 local nonprofits

### **OUR CHARITIES**

In April 2023, the Foundation Board awarded \$125,000 to 12 local charities that serve people in need in our nearby communities. This was possible because of the generous donations from hundreds of Pelican Sound community members who participated in our events and/or made direct donations to the Foundation.

#### Alliance for Period Supplies for SWFL

#### Providing Period Supplies - \$3,000

Alliance for Period Supplies of SWFL is a 501(c)(3) organization that provides free period supplies for at-risk women and girls in Collier and Lee Counties. By providing free monthly period products for financially challenged women and girls, they can participate fully in school, work, and daily life.



#### American Heart Association of SWFL LEADERS FOR A RESILIENT GENERATION - \$10,000

The American Heart Association of SWFL program supports children and their families who are impacted by congenital heart defects (CHD) through a variety of program in the local schools. The Leaders for A Resilient Generation program provides children in grades children in grades K-5 in Lee County with the resources, knowledge and support to live more full and healthy lives.



#### Café of Life

#### Ongoing Outreach Program - \$10,000

Café of Life in Bonita Springs is dedicated to meeting the basic human needs of the working poor, low-income seniors, and children. The Center at Leitner Neighborhood Park served over 21,000 daily mid-day meals to needy families and supports a takehome food pantry and a used clothing program. Funds from this grant provided for food, paper products, and hygiene items. The Foundation also worked with the Harrell family to facilitate an additional \$10,000 donation to this organization.

#### The Dubin Center

#### Dementia Caregiver Support & Education Program - \$12,000

The Dubin Center Dementia Caregiver Support and Education program provides training for caregivers of persons living with a dementia-related diagnosis through their Savvy Caregiver and Dealing with Dementia courses. The center is also available to coach caregivers through daily challenges often encountered by those living with dementia and is available to support caregivers by offering crisis support.



### **OUR CHARITIES**

#### Feeding the 5000 - \$10,000

The Lamb of God Church and Feeding The 5000-project work with community partners in the battle against hunger in our nearby communities. This grant will increase the quality and number of meals served to families during the Thanksgiving holiday in 2023. An additional 1700 meals will be provided to families because of this grant.



#### Guardian ad Litem Foundation 20th Judicial Circuit, Inc.

#### Children's Needs Program-\$10,000

The Guardian ad Litem Foundation Children's Needs Program provides funding for those who have been removed from their homes due to neglect, abuse or abandonment. The program provides vulnerable children with unwavering support, care, guidance, and resources to ensure their success in their new families, in school and in life.



#### Habitat for Humanity of Lee and Hendry Counties, Inc.

#### Appliances for New Homes - \$20,000

Habitat for Humanity provided essential appliances – refrigerator, stove, microwave, washer, dryer, and associated equipment – for ten new homes in Lee and Hendry County. The value of having energy efficient appliances in their homes greatly affects the quality of life for families in need of safe and affordable places to live.





#### **Hearts & Homes for Veterans, Inc.**

#### Veterans Assistance Program - \$10,000

Hearts & Homes for Veterans, Inc. was formed not just to be another charity, but to end homelessness and assist low-income veterans in SWFL who face challenges in their daily living. The grant will be used to assist veteran clients with emergency financial needs such as rent, temporary housing, utility costs, bus passes and gas cards.

#### **Interfaith Charities of SWFL**

#### The Reading Corner Program - \$5,000

Interfaith Charities of South Lee was provided funds for the purchase of book shelves and books for a new minilibrary for children and their families at the ICSL


Outreach Center. The Reading Corner is used by Summer Lunch attendees and has a weekly story time program throughout the year.



#### **Laces of Love**

#### Shoes for Children - \$10,000

The mission of Laces of Love is to provide new shoes, especially sneakers, to low income and disadvantaged children in Lee and Collier counties. Shoes are provided through a partnership with local schools and are purchased at a considerable discount from local sources that also partner with the organization.



#### **New Horizons of SWFL**

#### Super Kids Reading Camp - \$15,000

New Horizons' four-week Super Kids Reading Camp for K-5 students at five sites in Lee and Collier counties focuses on minimizing summer backslide particularly for students who speak English as a second language. Most students exceeded all outcomes for the program because of the individualized attention they receive at camp.



#### **Protected Harbor**

#### Wheelchair Accessible Raised Garden Beds - \$10,000

Protected Harbor serves the needs of adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities through group homes and a Supported Living Program for adults who do not need 24-hour assistance. This grant supports the that are handicapped and wheelchair accessible for residents of the group homes.

### **OUR EVENTS**

#### SPECIAL COLLECTION DRIVES AND EVENTS

The Pelican Sound Charitable Foundation also recognizes the generosity of the community and the desire to conduct charitable donation drives in times of need. These have included drives for food, hygiene products, clothing, among others and are considered special projects falling under the category of **Caring Hearts. Giving Spirits.** 

Leagues, informal groups, or individuals that desire to conduct a community-wide donation drive are encouraged to submit an application. The Foundation will work to facilitate marketing the special project with email blasts, the Social Wave, Upcoming Events and the Club Calendar and to balance the number of appeals to the community throughout the year. An example of our donation drives include:

#### Cafe of Life Diaper Drive - 30,954 Diapers Donated!

Generous donations to Cafe of Life represent a \$13,000 contribution and provided a huge relief to parents who struggle to afford this expensive necessity.





The PSCF also has special events that do not fall under the fundraising category but are educational and promotional. Examples of our special events include:

#### Volunteer Fair

The Pelican Sound Charitable Foundation Volunteer Fair was a huge success! The theme of the Fair was "Find your passion! Get involved! Make a difference" The Fair's purpose was to provide residents of Pelican Sound an opportunity to learn about where they might volunteer in our area. Twenty-six non-profit organizations were present to talk with approximately 150 residents who attended the Fair.

#### **Sound Learning**

This year the Foundation sponsored a presentation by the Dubin Center. Similar events are planned for the future.
