OUR GRANTMAKING STORY

In 2018, the Pelican Sound Golf and River Club Administration and Board of Directors welcomed the concept of organizing a way to manage the many requests for charitable fundraising and donation drive events. An ad hoc committee explored options, and the **Pelican Sound Charitable Foundation** was created and approved by the PSGRC Board of Directors in 2019.

With over 94,000 charitable and nonprofit organizations in Florida alone, and over 6,000 registered in Lee County, the Foundation had to decide how to focus its efforts. Knowing that many of the community members donate generously to nonprofits in their out-of-state communities, it was determined that the Foundation would focus on *people in need* in its nearby communities in Southwest Florida. Thus, our mission statement was developed to reflect this goal.

The mission of the Pelican Sound Charitable Foundation (PSCF) is to support charitable and educational programs of organizations that improve the lives of SWFL residents in need.

Every year, community members are invited to nominate charities that provide direct services of food, clothing, shelter or health needs, or that provide direct educational services such as literacy or job skills for people in need in Southwest Florida. The committee then reviews the qualifications of the organizations, their nonprofit ratings and their financial stability to determine their eligibility. The charities that qualify are then invited to submit a grant application to the Foundation.

In the first three years of the Foundation, we awarded over \$250,000 to 17 local nonprofits, listed below - **THANKS TO THE GENEROSITY OF OUR COMMUNITY MEMBERS**.

The Pelican Sound Charitable Foundation also recognizes the generosity of the community and the desire to conduct charitable donation drives in times of need. These have included drives for food, hygiene products, clothing, among others and are considered special projects falling under the category of **Caring Hearts. Giving Spirits.**

The Foundation will work to facilitate marketing the special project with email blasts, the Social Wave, Upcoming Events and the Club Calendar and to balance the number of appeals to the community throughout the year.

This was possible because of the generous donations from hundreds of Pelican Sound community members who participated in our events and/or made direct donations to the Foundation.

American Heart Association of SWFL

Supporting Children with Heart Disease (CHD) - \$12,500

The American Heart Association of SWFL supports the Heart Heroes Program for children and their families who are impacted by congenital heart defects (CHD). The program helps kids connect and navigate the challenges of living with CHD through their Camp



Boggy Creek Family Getaway Weekends program, as well as a variety of local support programs. The American Heart Association is dedicated to providing families with the resources, knowledge and support to live more full and healthy lives.





Café of Life

Ongoing Outreach Program - \$15,000

Café of Life in Bonita Springs is dedicated to meeting the basic human needs of the working poor, low-income seniors and children.





The program helps families overcome nutritional insecurity, especially in this time of high food inflation. The Café of Life Center at Leitner Neighborhood Park served over 21,000 daily mid-day meals to needy families, and it also supports a take-home food pantry and a used clothing program. Funds from this grant provided for food, paper products, diapers and hygiene items for families in Bonita Springs and Immokalee.



The Dubin Center

Dementia Caregiver Support & Education Program - \$15,000

The Dubin Center Dementia Caregiver Support and Education program provides training for caregivers

and persons living with a dementia-related diagnosis through their Savvy Caregiver and Dealing with Dementia courses. The center is also available to coach caregivers through daily challenges often encountered by those living with dementia and is available to support caregivers by offering crisis support. Support groups are offered once per month and Zoom options are available to enable those caregivers who travel north to stay connected during the rest of the year.



Guardian ad Litem Foundation 20th Judicial Circuit, Inc. *Children's Needs Program-* \$12,500

The Guardian ad Litem Foundation Children's Needs Program provides funding for youth who have been removed from their homes due to neglect, abuse or abandonment. Child Advocates identify needs the caregivers cannot afford and





other agencies do not provide. Grant funds were used to support the fulfillment of 145 Children Needs requests for 138 children. Requests include such things as *Happier Birthday*, camp, clothing, lessons, tutoring and sports participation. The program helps children fit in with their peers and feel "normal" during their time in the system.

Golden Paws Assistance Dogs

Veteran Service Dog Program - \$5,000

The Golden Paws Assistance Dogs program for Veteran Service Dogs provides financial support for nutrition, grooming and veterinary expenses for veteran recipients of service dogs who might otherwise not be able to care for their service animal. The program has a 95% successful placement rate that is based



largely on the long-term commitment to the recipient/service dog teams. This commitment not only includes training but more importantly, the recipients know they are never in a position to have to choose whether to feed their family or feed and care for their service dog.

Habitat for Humanity of Lee and Hendry Counties, Inc.

Appliances for Seven New Homes - \$15,000

A total of seven Habitat families received essential appliances – refrigerator, stove, microwave, washer, dryer and associated equipment – for new homes in Lee County. Habitat homeowners' lives are transformed by appliances. An in-home washer means no more time (and quarters) spent in a laundromat, allowing for more family time. A stove means that meals can be cooked without having to rely on a hot



plate, and a full-sized refrigerator of their own means that weekly family meals can be prepared – another cost and time-saving measure.

Harry Chapin Food Bank of Southwest Florida, Inc. *Partner Agency Program - \$15,000*

The mission of the Harry Chapin Food Bank is to lead our community in the fight to end hunger. The Food Bank



works with vetted community partners to provide shelf stable fruits, vegetables, proteins, grains and milk, as well as fresh produce and other perishable foods to local distribution sites and provides the partner agencies with roughly 70% of their food inventory. Prior to the pandemic, the Food Bank spent roughly \$37,500 per month on food. Currently, it has been spending approximately 1 million dollars per month on food.

Interfaith Charities of SWFL

Food Pantry and Personal Hygiene Supplies - \$15,000 Interfaith Charities of South Lee was established to provide for those in our local community who suffer from






neglect, illness, handicaps or other difficulties. Programs support 1,240 households with 3,224 individuals that are considered the working poor. Funds were used to purchase food pantry items as well as hygiene supplies that are not covered by Food Stamps. These items include shampoo, conditioner, soap, lotion, toothpaste, dish and laundry soaps, etc.

Laces of Love

Shoes for Children - \$10,000

The mission of Laces of Love is to provide new shoes, especially sneakers, to lowincome and disadvantaged children in Lee and Collier counties and to educate the public on their needs. With the funds received from the Foundation, approximately 275 - 300 pairs of shoes were purchased and delivered to children prior to the start of school. Shoes are purchased at a considerable discount from local sources that also partner with the organization.




New Horizons of SWFL

Super Kids Reading Camp - \$15,000

During the summer of 2022, New Horizons operated its four-week Super Kids Reading Camp for K-5 students at five sites in Lee and



Collier counties. The camp focuses on minimizing summer backslide





Our Mother's Home

Mentored Living Program - \$15,000

The goal of Our Mother's Home is to break the cycle of generational poverty by providing a safe and nurturing haven for young mothers (age 11-21) and



their babies who are in need a temporary transitional group home. Services at the home include a Mentored Living Program that focuses on positive and healthy parenting skills and life skills for independent living. The program also ensures that all young mothers have their physical and mental health needs met, such as medical care, medication, physicals, ob-gyn, vision, psychiatric assessments and therapy.

Protected Harbor

SPECIAL STRONG Wellness Program - \$5,000

Protected Harbor's Wellness Initiative is an integral part of the services provided for adults with special needs. "Special Strong" is a virtual exercise training



program for individuals with mental, physical and cognitive challenges. Residents watch the online classes and participate in the exercises with staff assistance. The program addresses a healthy lifestyle, good food choices, as well as physical and emotional health. Since most of the clients cannot independently choose to make lifestyle improvements, the Wellness Initiative supports and encourages healthy lifestyles.

Spooktacular Golf Tournament

The Spooktacular Golf Tournament was held on Saturday, October 23, 2021. This 4-person scramble had 140 golfers participating and netted over \$6,000 for the Foundation. The follow-up dinner and awards ceremony were a special "treat" for everyone!



Kick-Off 2022 Super Bowl Golf Tournament

The Kick-Off 2022 Super Bowl Golf Tournament was held on Monday, January 31, 2022, and despite a frost delay and a last-minute necessity to change to a 9-hole tournament, participation was strong and netted over \$10,000 for the Foundation.
